## THE CITY OF SOUTHAMPTON (RESIDENTS PARKING) (ZONES 1-12 & 16) (AMENDMENT 24) ORDER 2021

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT SOUTHAMPTON CITY COUNCIL proposes to make the above Order, the effects of which would be:

- 1 To introduce a goods vehicle loading bay restriction in **St Mary's Road**, *South-west side*, From 2m north-west of the boundary between 49/50 St Mary's Road north-westwards for 7m (in place of the existing Parking Places with 2 hour limit (No Return Same Day) 8am -6pm Monday to Saturday Except Permit Holders).
- 2 To introduce pay and display parking (8am 6pm Monday to Saturday, 1pm 6pm Sundays, Bank and Public Holidays) in St Mary's Road, South-west side, From 9m north-west of the boundary between 49/50 St Mary's Road north-westwards for 34m (in place of the existing Parking Places with 2 hour limit (No Return Same Day) 8am 6pm Monday to Saturday Except Permit Holders).

The following charges would apply:

- Stays of up to 10 minutes Free (with ticket from the machine)
- Stays of up to 30 minutes £1.00
- Stays of up to 1 hour £2.00
- Stays of up to 1.5 hours £3.00
- Stays of up to 2 hours £4.00
- 3 To introduce no loading at any time restrictions in **St Mary's Road**, *North-east side*, From its junction with Oxford Avenue to its junction with Brintons Road; **Brintons Road**, *North-east side*, From its junction with St Mary's Road to its junction with Argyle Road and **Argyle Road**, *north* side, From its junction with **Brintons Road** up to and including the southern access to the Fire Station car park.
