




96% of respondents have access to 1 or more motorvehicle 39% do not have access to a bicycle in their household





69% travel by car daily


64% use public transport (bus) less than once a month or never

29% never use public transport




















Q3 In a typical week, how do you travel for the following trips? (please select your main mode of transport for each).






Q3 In a typical week, how do you travel for the following trips? (please select your main mode of transport for each).






















Q4 Which is your main mode of transport?




Q5 Referring to your answer in Question 5, please select the reasons you choose this as your main mode of transport.




Q6 What are the main reasons stopping you from using active travel (walking and cycling) for more of your journeys?





Q7 How would you rate the following, in relation to Bitterne Road East and the area around it?





78% consider access to local amenities to be good or very good.

59% consider connection to public transport to be good or very good.

73% consider the ease of getting about by motor vehicle to be good or very good.

Only 48% consider the ease of crossing roads on foot to be good or very good. 35% consider it to be poor or very poor.

33% consider air quality in the airea to be poor or very poor.

44% consider the level of noise from traffic to be poor or very poor


47% consider the condition of the pavements to be poor or very poor.

36% consider the provision of cycle lanes in the area to be poor or very poor. Only 26% consider it to be good or very good.
















Q9 If we improve walking and cycling in the local area, what impact do you feel this will have on you, local businesses and the wider community?
