

PUBLIC NOTICE

THE CITY OF SOUTHAMPTON (OAKLANDS DEVELOPMENT) ORDER 2023

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT SOUTHAMPTON CITY COUNCIL as part of the redevelopment of the former Oaklands School (known as Starboard Way), proposes to make the above Order, the effects of which would be:

1. To introduce **No Waiting at Any Time** on all sides of Starboard Way, except for the following locations;
 - a. Layby opposite 7-11 Starboard Way
 - b. Layby opposite 99-100 Starboard Way
 - c. Starboard Way, closed end, between properties 107-111 (private road)
 - d. Starboard Way, closed end, between properties 115-118 (private road)
2. To introduce **Limited Waiting** for 4 hours, Monday to Friday, 8am – 6pm, no return within the same day, in the following lengths of Starboard Way;
 - a. The entire layby opposite properties 7-11 Starboard Way
 - b. The entire layby opposite properties 99-100 Starboard Way
3. To introduce a **Prohibition of Cycling** on the section of footway, between 104 and 105 Starboard Way, from its junction with Starboard Way north-eastwards to the existing cycle track.
