### Introduction and background



Southampton City Council have been successful in securing Active Travel Fund (ATF) funding improvements to create Safer Routes to Schools. Roads covered by this funding are Bassett Green (Honeysuckle Road), Beechwood Junior, Glenfield Infants (Mousehole Lane), Freemantle C of E Community Academy (Waterloo Road) and Hightown Primary (Tunstall Road and Warburton Road).

This survey was ran to hear from users, residents and pupils to understand how they travel the road currently, for what reasons and by what mode as well as what they would like to see improved. With a focus in the funding terms on walking and cycling we also looked to understand what improvements could be made to make the areas a more attractive place for these modes.

The survey ran from 03 July 23 – 23 July 23, and was promoted through letters to residents, on the Connecting Southampton website, Next Door social media, working with School Travel Champions and School Headteachers for surveys to be carried out in school and via school parent comms systems and newsletters.





## **Key findings – adults survey**




Main modes of travel within the area is **motor vehicle or walking**, and over half of respondents use their main mode of travel because it is **convenient**.



The most selected **barriers to cycling** in the area is that the **road/infrastructure is not safe** (41%), and because of **bad road user behaviour** (39%).






## Key findings – adults survey




In terms of satisfaction with different things within the area, respondents are most satisfied with the access to local amenities and connections to public transport.

Respondents told us they are most dissatisfied with safety of children on the way to and from school, and the safety of cycling.



84% of respondents support improvements to road safety, and 63% told us that improvements to walking and cycling would encourage them to walk or cycle more.



There were 15 separate suggestions made within the survey to increase crossings in the area.

## **Key findings – pupils**



The majority of pupils within the survey told us that they would like:

- Fewer cars on the street when they go to and from school (78%)



- More space to walk, cycle, scoot and wheel to school (77%)









## **Key findings – adults survey**




Main modes of travel within the area is **motor vehicle or walking**, and over half of respondents use their main mode of travel because it is **convenient**.



The most selected **barriers to cycling** in the area is that the **road/infrastructure is not safe** (55%), and because of **bad road user behaviour** (51%).





## Key findings – adults survey



In terms of satisfaction with different things within the area, respondents are most satisfied with the access to local amenities and ease of getting around by motor vehicle. Respondents told us they are most dissatisfied with safety of children on the way to and from school, and ease of crossing roads on foot.



94% of respondents support improvements to road safety, and 72% told us that improvements to walking and cycling would encourage them to walk or cycle more.



There were 89 separate suggestions made within the survey to increase crossings in the area.

## **Key findings – pupils**



The majority of pupils within the survey told us that they would like:

- Fewer cars on the street when they go to and from school (89%)



- More space to walk, cycle, scoot and wheel to school (82%)











## Key findings – adults survey




Main modes of travel within the area is **motor vehicle or walking**, and over half of respondents use their main mode of travel because it is **convenient**.



The most selected **barriers to cycling** in the area is that the **road/infrastructure is not safe** (47%), and because of **bad road user behaviour** (44%).






## **Key findings – adults survey**




In terms of satisfaction with different things within the area, respondents are most satisfied with the access to local amenities and connections to public transport.

Respondents told us they are most dissatisfied with the conditions of pavements and the quality of air.



92% of respondents support improvements to road safety, and 49% told us that improvements to walking and cycling would encourage them to walk or cycle more.





There were 15 separate suggestions made within the survey for **less traffic and more traffic calming measures**.



## **Key findings – pupils**



The majority of pupils within the survey told us that they would like:

- Fewer cars on the street when they go to and from school (76%)



- More places to safely cross roads (83%) ☐ ☐ ☐

- More space to walk, cycle, scoot and wheel to school (79%)











Question: How many of each of the following do you and your household have access to?

















Main modes of travel within the area is motor vehicle or walking, and over half of respondents use their main mode of travel because it is **convenient**.



The most selected **barriers to cycling** in the area is that the road/infrastructure is not safe (35%), and because of bad road user behaviour (35%).






## **Key findings – adults survey**




In terms of satisfaction with different things within the area, respondents are most satisfied with the connections to public transport and access to local schools.

Respondents told us they are **most dissatisfied** with the safety of children on the way to school, and ease of crossing roads on foot.



100% of respondents support proposals to improve walking and safety, and 71% told us that improvements to walking and cycling would encourage them to walk or cycle more.



There were 9 separate suggestions made within the survey for **more crossings**.

- More places to safely cross roads (95%)










