For the benefit of the new attendees at this meeting, IS provided an overview of the Southampton Enhanced Partnership and progress with the Bus Service Improvement Plan. With specific reference to achievements over the past 3 months and activities planned for the next 3 months.

#### **General comments:**

- PB advised that the BSIP/BGF funding process is now levelling out with good funding settlements to local transport authorities.
- IS discussed the DfT requirement for quarterly reporting on BGF funding and the Bus indicator Pilot which allows LTA's to confirm what data methods are available to assist with the quarterly reporting. CM added that HCC would be able to provide the details annually rather than quarterly.
- A discussion took place regarding the new weekend Park and Ride service which following completion of actions surrounding the UHS car park will start in late September 2025. PB asked whether the service could commence from Saturday 13 September to coincide with events in the city that weekend.

**Action –** HCC to follow up the request for adequate signage directing motorists towards the Park & Ride car park from Hampshire roads.

• IS went through the August BGF changes. PB added that the SCC/HCC partnership is working well with joint funding on services serving the wider city travel to work area.

## 4 EP Working Group Highlights

### Supported Bus Services

 Updated information on SCC Supported/Enhanced Service – PB thanked the team for providing the slide covering the supported bus services and the associated cost per passenger in that clear style, with this outstanding action now closed.

#### Spending Review

- Summary of the 2025 Spending Review including Local Transport Grant funding to SCC & HCC, £3 Fare Cap to March 2027, Bus Grant Funding and Combined Active Travel Fund;
- RT discussed that the £3 fare cap has resulted in a 3-4% loss of commercial revenue from areas outside of the city. In the city, a greater number of customers are buying day and week tickets. The £1 evening fare continues to do well.
- RT added that city services are achieving 3% annual growth.

## <u>Devolution</u>

- PB provided an overview of devolution and local government reorganisation. There is an Officers Working Group on Transport with sub-group on public transport;
- Cllr Bowerman commented that this is a really good opportunity for working together with the unitary authorities and a good time to start having these conversations now. Cllr Lambert agreed that this is a good opportunity for Southampton.
- RT asked how the Mayoral County Combined Authority (MCCA) will affect the individual EP boards, will there by one or multiple? PB advised that this is being looked at and will be confirmed.
